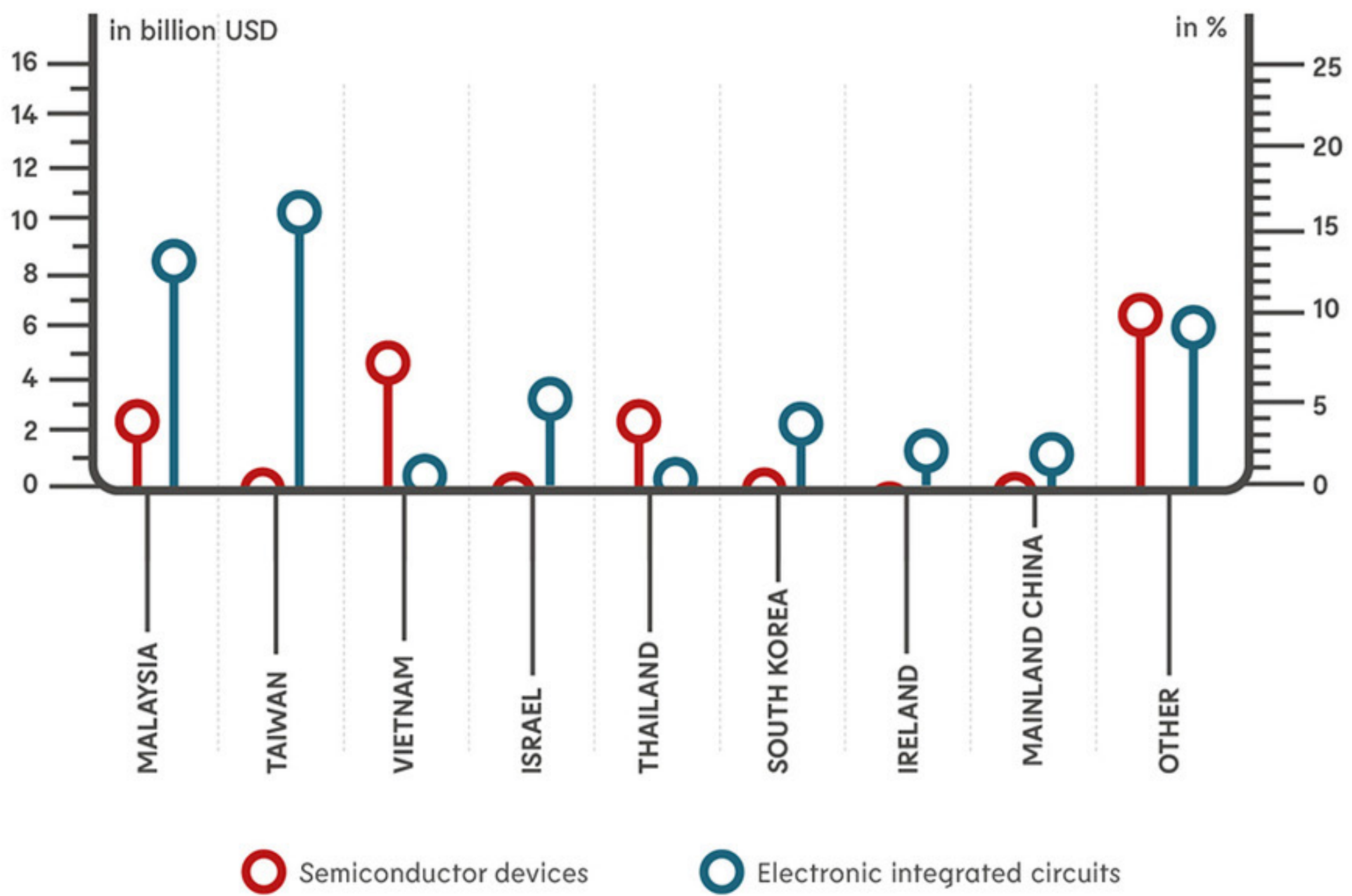


U.S. semiconductor tariffs: Major chip exporters in the crosshairs of new trade curbs

Weekly Facts & Figures.

- **U.S. Launches Chip Probe:** A Section 232 investigation could lead to tariffs on semiconductor imports.
- **Tariffs of 25% or More:** Key suppliers face potential duties, disrupting supply chains.
- **Exemptions in Question:** Chips were previously spared, but are now under active review for new trade measures.
