


China trade: April export growth to Southeast Asia offsets U.S. slump



Weekly Facts & Figures.

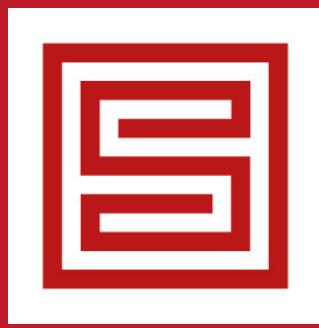
- **Export growth:** China's exports rose 8.1% in April, driven by strong trade with ASEAN (+20.8%), Latin America, Africa, and India.
- **U.S. trade slump:** Exports to the U.S. dropped 21%, imports 14%, pushing bilateral trade to a 15-year low amid steep tariffs.
- **Structural concerns:** Despite strong exports, factory activity shrank, producer prices fell (-2.7%), and job losses signal deeper issues.

What This Means.

"China is offsetting U.S. tariffs with new trade partners—April's export jump shows the pivot toward ASEAN, Africa, and Latin America is gaining traction."
